The message here is that there are many ways to volunteer without having to run towards the fire. We welcome anyone who can volunteer some time to keep our vital mission going. Chief's Report

Greetings from Chief Neuroth

By now it's the middle of summer and if conditions have stayed true to predictions, it's warmer and drier. Grasses are starting to turn brown on south facing slopes and seasonal streams are dry. When conditions are like this, residents have a heightened awareness. You are our eyes and noses to help spot and detect fires, so I would like to lay out some guidelines to help in that process.

First, if you smell smoke, step outside and determine which direction the wind is coming from. Is the smell strong or just a slight smell? We can get smoke from fires that are a great distance away — e.g., the fire up by Red Feather had smoke drifting our way.

Second, do you see smoke? Is it a haze, a wisp, or is there definite concentration? Take a few minutes to observe the smoke. Does it grow in intensity, stay the same, or dissipate as when someone is starting a fireplace or a woodstove? (We've even had smoke reports from somebody starting a diesel tractor.)

Next, if you feel your observations warrant a call to 911, please have the following information for us:

(1) your name; (2) where you are calling from; (3) your phone number, so we can contact you for more information, if needed; (4) what you are seeing — i.e., hazy conditions, actual smoke, drifting or a column, color of the smoke (white, light grey, or dark, each of which this tells us a lot about what we're looking for); (5) what direction is the smoke relative to where you are — for this, a compass or compass app on your phone is helpful; (6) how far away the smoke is — distance is hard to judge, so give us your best guess; (7) if you see actual flames, how tall the flames are, what is burning (e.g., grass or trees), how big the area is that is on fire (e.g., 1/10 acre or bigger, again, just give us your best estimate). All these pieces of information will help us find the fire more quickly. The few extra minutes you take to gather this information will save us time and make our response faster. Thank you for your help.

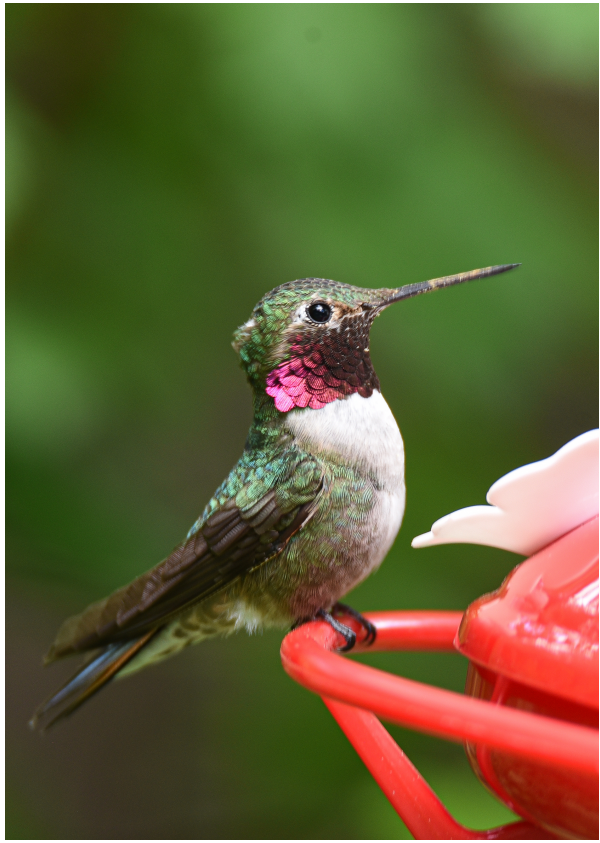

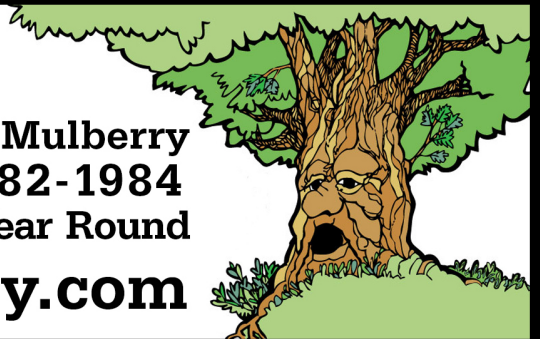

Notes from Your Area Representatives, *cont'd*

Weather here in the Lower Buckhorn has significantly moved into summer temperatures and afternoon and evening thunderstorms. We love the rain but need to be aware of the potential of a lightning strike starting a wildfire. Please keep your eyes open to that potential since our area has had a devastating history of these kind of fires. Remember that all of us need a true defensible space around our buildings to protect them from fire. One of the major causes of fire spread is, of course, wind that blows fire brands that start new fires. But equally important is radiant heat starting fires from as much as 50 feet away. When fire reaches temperatures over 1000 degrees F, that heat can quickly start something else that's combustible on fire by heat waves passing through the air. Please protect your valuable property.

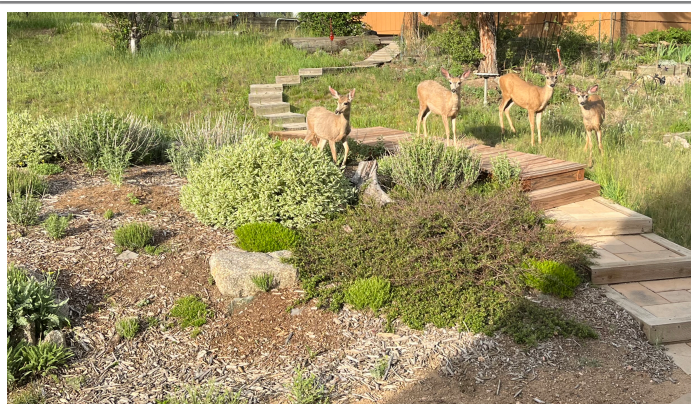

Mini-Libraries



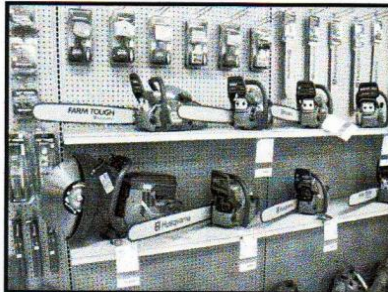

HERE'S WHAT WE'RE DOING ABOUT IT:

As part of our ongoing effort to detect and prevent seller impersonation and absentee owner scams, we have partnered with Mitek and their identity document authentication software during a transaction to divert potential scams right away. For certain transactions where the property is vacant, non-owner occupied or free and clear, Mitek's software allows us to verify the identification of the seller(s) to the real estate transaction as soon as the order is opened with us.

Did You Know?
